

2007-2008 Psychology Department Classes

The following table is a projection based on an annual survey of the psychology faculty. The department attempts to maintain a predictable pattern of classes, but the accuracy of this pattern **is not guaranteed** because of unforeseen changes in enrollment patterns and teaching personnel. An “X” indicates that a course has a high probability of being offered during that semester. The availability of courses marked with a “?” is dependent upon a combination of enrollment patterns and the availability of faculty who possess the expertise and willingness to teach them.

Important Note: Students who are finishing their major and who need to complete specific classes to fulfill specific requirements (e.g., a capstone lab for a B.S. degree) should contact the instructors of these classes at least one semester prior to the semester when they plan to enroll to insure the accuracy of this table.
